



# MEMBER CODE OF CONDUCT

As representatives of the Irish Freedom Party a high level of decorum is expected of all members in order to build and preserve confidence and trust in our party, and our ideals as a whole.

We are only as strong as our weakest link.

The following is a set of minimum standards by which members shall adhere to within all aspects of party business.

A breach of these standards will result in disciplinary action and/or dismissal from the party.

1. As spokespersons of the party, all members shall be respectful, kind and courteous when interacting with others in all manners of party business. Members shall conduct themselves in a manner that is positive toward the ideals and reputation of the party.
2. Discriminatory language or behaviour in person, in public or on social media etc. will not be tolerated. We stand against discrimination in all its forms.
3. Bullying or harassment will not be tolerated.
4. Violence, incitement of others to violence and provocation to violence will not be tolerated.
5. Corruption will not be tolerated. This includes the personal gain, monetary or other (eg. cronyism, nepotism) of any member by means of party connection, information or relationship
6. Privacy of other members and their data must be respected. Personal information of members can only be used for party business. Discretion must be used when dealing with sensitive or personal matters.
7. Members are required to familiarise themselves with and adhere to the statutory regulations issued by the Standards in Public Office (SIPO)
8. The silencing or censoring of another member or non-member will not be tolerated unless they are in conflict with the other rules listed within this document
9. Members are requested to hold membership and/or affiliation with the IFP only and not with other political parties
